**REMINDER - SEND (Special Educational Needs and/or Disability):** If you need to speak to us about your child's special education needs or a disability, the class teacher is your first point of call, but Miss Maxfield is also available to speak to you. **REMINDER:** All bags need to be small enough to fit onto a peg with approx. 15cm width. Years 1-5 are allowed a school book bag (that is stored in a box) and a drawer string bag for their PE kit. Year 6 are allowed a school bag, which can be a small rucksack, but it must be able to fit within the width of the pegs. If your child needs to bring in extra kit or clothes for an after school club or for an after school activity, then the class teacher will arrange an alternative storage place.

**REMINDER:** KS2 are allowed **one reasonable sized pencil case** which will fit into your child's drawer.

**SAFETY:** We have had several children commenting on the online games that they have been playing on at home. Some of these have included 'Grand Theft Auto' and 'Call of Duty'. These games are rated 18 and over and are not suitable for primary aged children. We ask you to be vigilant with your children when playing computer games at home.

**SAFETY:** Now that the garages by school are about to be demolished, the back school gate by the field will be open for you to use in the morning and afternoon. Please take care whilst walking along the path by the garages.

## **LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS**

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of *Platt v Isle of Wight Council* which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who are absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

*Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.*

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).
